### TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH (ALT HILL ROAD, ASHTON UNDER LYNE)(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) (EXPERIMENTAL) ORDER 2022

Tameside Metropolitan Borough Council have made the above Orders on the 7 day of December 2022 under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and all other enabling powers the effects of which will be to introduce prohibition of driving on:-

- a) Alt Hill Lane, Ashton-under-Lyne from its junction with Parkbridge Road to its junction with the unnamed private access road that serves the properties at Westerhill;
- b) Alt Hill Road, Ashton-u-Lyne from a point 22 metres north-west of its junction with Alt Hill Lane to a point 46 metres south-east of its junction with Mill Brow.

The above restrictions will be introduced for an experimental period of up to 18 months. The Council will in due course consider whether the provisions of the Experimental Orders should continue in force indefinitely or the existing conditions be reinstated. Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or its provisions on the grounds that it or they are outside the Council's powers, or that the legal procedure has not been followed, may within 6 weeks from the date of the Order, apply to the High Court for that purpose.


#### TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH (ALT HILL ROAD, ASHTON UNDER LYNE)(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) (EXPERIMENTAL) ORDER 2022


The Experimental Traffic Regulation Orders will prevent through traffic along Alt Hill Lane and Alt Hill Road, Ashton-under-Lyne. This will potentially reduce the volume of traffic utilising these routes / roads.

The impetus of these Orders is to enhance the amenity and safety of the Alt Hill area for the benefit of residents, walkers, horse riders and cyclists. Restricting access for vehicular traffic will also reduce the problem of fly tipping that is prevalent in the Alt Hill area.

As the Orders are to be introduced on an experimental basis it will enable the Council to assess any potential impact on all users of these roads over the first 6 months of operation, which is also the length of the objection period.

The Experimental Traffic Regulation Order will be implemented for a maximum period of 18 months to enable a judgement to be made on any possible long term impact on access for all road users before consideration is given to make the Orders permanent or not.

- 2. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to, and not in derogation from, any restrictions or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the said Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

- Save as provided in Article 2 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed in that length of road, known as Alt Hill Road in the town of Ashton-under-Lyne, from a point 22 metres north-west of its junction with Alt Hill Lane to a point 46 metres south-east of its junction with Mill Brow.
- 2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful for any person to cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed in the roads referred to in that article, if the vehicle is being used:-
  - (a) for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
  - (b) in connection with agricultural operations in or adjacent to that road;
  - (c) if the vehicle is being used in service of a local authority for the maintenance of the road or to access Local Nature Reserves adjacent to it.
- 3. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to, and not in derogation from, any restrictions or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the said Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.
