


There were over 250 service users and 27 carers who came!







It's one idea of what we could do because we have so many problems with the lift.


Before any decisions are made I will come and talk to everyone at Toll Bar House so that we can all agree on what is the best thing to do.

Some information from the health checks by The Health Improvement Team...

51 people had a health check, 33 people who use services & 18 support workers/parents /carers, these included:



- 20 females
- 31 males
- ✓ People who had a health check were aged between 23 and 82
- ✓ 43 people had their weight checked, 14 people were the right weight for their height!



- × 2 people were underweight
- × 35 people were overweight





- √ 36 people were 'ok'
- × 2 people had 'High' blood pressure
- × 3 people had 'Low' blood pressure
- × 7 people were advised to go to their doctors for a check up

Drop in style meant some people arrived late in the day or left early and missed parts of the event.

People spread out too much – the Venue was very big.

There were a lot of workshops & activities – people couldn't get round them all

Location of the Venue made it difficult to get to.

There were large groups of service users with only a couple of staff – this meant people couldn't split up and try different things.

Has the Big Chat got too big? Where do we go from here? A lot of people stayed in the dining area and assembly hall rather than going to workshops.

What about a weekend event?


Housing would be a good theme for next year. People asked a lot of questions about this.
