Location: Portland Basin Museum or Astley Cheetham Art Gallery

Key Stage : Key Stage 1, 2, 3, 4

A choice of morning (10am - 11.30am) or afternoon (1pm - 2.30pm) workshop

Introduction:

What is Architecture? How can we tell how old a building is?

Participants will be introduced to a variety of architecture based in and around Tameside.

There will be a focus on how architecture has changed over the last 200 years. The workshop is led by our artist facilitator, who will show and discuss a range of different buildings, focusing on the differing styles and architectural details. Participants will be able to identify which buildings are from the past through to modern day.

Pupils will consider what they have learnt whilst in the gallery, going on to take part in a variety of art based activities.

Learning Outcomes.

Children will be able to identify different architectural details and how the landscape has changed over the last 200 years. Pupils will be aware of buildings within the local area and how important this is for our heritage.

National Curriculum links:

- to develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space
- to learn about great artists, architects and designers in history
- to use a range of techniques and media
- to increase their proficiency in the handling of different materials
- to analyse and evaluate their own work, and that of others, in order to strengthen the visual impact or applications of their work
- a local history study

<p>10.10 - 10.30am</p>	<p>During the workshop</p> <p>Pupils will take part in creative art activities that include:</p> <p>Activity 1 (20 minutes) Timeline of the landscape of Tameside.</p> <p>Pupils will create a collaged landscape based on the architecture of Tameside showing how the towns have developed over time. The landscape will change from empty landscape with trees and rivers of 1750 to a busy Industrial scene of supermarkets, refurbished and repurposed buildings as offices and housing of today.</p>
<p>10.30 - 10.40am</p>	<p>Activity 2 (10 minutes) Look at Architectural detail.</p> <p>Participants will spend time focusing on the finer detail. Whilst spending time in the gallery each will draw a terraced house with architectural features and details, including lintels, ledges, fanlights, roof tile patterns, ridge tiles etc.</p>
<p>10.40 - 11.20am</p>	<p>Activity 3 (40 minutes) Make a vibrant Town Centre.</p> <p>Participants will receive a piece of paper with a named building from a Town Centre, covering two hundred years of architecture. Buildings will include: a Town Hall, a library, an art gallery, mills, warehouses, a police station, a religious building, offices, a college, apartments and lots of different shop types.</p> <p>Using photocopy sheets of architectural details each will add drawing to create their own individual building. Following this the class will work together to build their very own collaged townscape, adding detail such as scaled people.</p>
<p>11.20 - 11.30am</p>	<p>Tidy away and finish</p> <p>Plenary, Questions and Answers: Full Class: Participants to reflect on the experience and make comparisons. What have they enjoyed/disliked the most?</p> <p>Please note: <i>Activity timings are flexible and may vary.</i></p> <p>What you will get during the day:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Indoor space for storing bags and coats. A space to eat lunch if required. Toilets and lift access. • Professional and experienced education facilitator to lead learning activities during your visit. • All equipment, worksheets and art materials required.
