

MAKE A BIRD FEEDER

This winter, when food is scarce for wild birds, help them by making one of these easy bird feeders and they will be regular visitors to your outdoor space.



Apple feeder

1. Make a hole through the centre of your apple and thread the string through the hole.
2. Make an 'x' with the sticks and tie them to the string so the apple sits on top (this gives the birds something to perch on!)
3. Cover your apple with tasty seeds, (sunflower seeds are great) pushing them into the apple.
4. Hang outside for the birds to enjoy.



What you will need:

- Some seeds
- 1 Apple
- Length of string
- 2 Twigs

Pine Cone feeder

1. Mix together the seeds, lard and cheese and raisins in a bowl. Make it really mushy!
2. Tie a string to your pine cone then cover it with the mix. Don't forget to fill the holes.
3. Pop it in the fridge until it is set.
4. Hang outside for the birds to enjoy.



What you will need:

Pine cones
String
Cheese, Raisins and Seeds
Lard

Fruit Hoops

1. Cut pieces of apple and cheese into small cubes.
2. Thread the pieces and raisins on to garden wire or pipe cleaners. You may need to make holes in the cubes for younger children.
3. Make a hoop with the wire.
4. Hang outside for the birds to enjoy.
