Biggest take away from the show was the need to adopt a whole family approach to supporting young people's MH. The need for allowing parent voice to be heard and the impact of hidden harm on siblings – is this being address within the system?

Navigating the System

Anthony Seddon and Action Togethers parent group has highlighted the surge in ESBA within Tameside and the challenges faced by parents in knowing what path to take and how to support there young people, "anxiety" the biggest cause of ESBA based on feedback from parents and partners. Parents would like strategies and resources to help them support their young people, Sue also feels pupil "peer support" is needed to help young people back into school environment. Is the whole school approach being practiced widely among schools? This must start from top down to work.

Family Hubs

In May 2022, Tameside Council was one of seventy-five (75) Local Authorities identified to receive a share of the £301.75 million (a joint venture from the Department for Education (DfE) and Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) to implement the Family Hubs and Best Start for Life Programme in the years 2022-25.
