GROUP WORKSHOP



This is a hard-hitting workshop for up to 25 young people and will teach them about:

- Myths surrounding gangs and street culture
- Negative associations (peer groups)
- Grooming and Initiation
- Dangers of taking drugs & drug distribution
- Child sexual exploitation
- Building motivation & purpose

We offer a 1 or 2 hour workshop for young people identified as being in a gang or associated in gangs membership.

OUTCOMES

- Provides confidential opportunities for young people to speak openly to ex-gang members.
- A greater understanding of the myths that surrounds gang culture.
- Understanding the nature of relationships (peer groups) which are characterised by manipulation and violence.
- Promoting education, training, employment, and enterprise.



GROUP MENTORING




This group mentoring programme is delivered by ex-gang members and addresses the following:

- Grooming into gangs
- Myths surrounding gangs and street culture
- Consequences of offending
- Building motivation & purpose

This can be either be a 6 or 12 week mentoring programme for young people aged between 9 – 18 involved in gangs or associated in gang and street culture.

OUTCOMES FOR INTERVENTION

- Provides confidential opportunities for young people to speak openly to ex-gang members.

ONE2ONE MENTORING

This one2one mentoring programme is delivered by ex-gang members and is tailored to each young person's needs, using an individual development plan that acts as a guide for their exit strategy.

Mentors may address the following topics:

- Grooming into gangs
- Myths surrounding gangs and street culture
- Consequences of offending
- The dangers of taking drugs & drugs distribution
- Building motivation & purpose

GANGS MENTOR



The gangs mentor is an 6 or 12 months fixed post which has been designed for schools, colleges, people referral units and prisons. The gangs mentor will work on-site for between 5-7 hours per week.

This role provides:

- Mentoring
- Mediation
- Support and Advice services

Young people can drop-in, self-refer and be referred. This role delivers one2one and group sessions for young people identified as being involved in gang activity.

OUTCOMES

- Provides confidential opportunities for young people to speak openly to ex-gang members .
- Equips students and young people with the knowledge to avoid grooming, initiation & gang activity.
- Understand the dangers of young people carrying weapons, taking and selling drugs.
- Help young people reach their potential by providing information about apprenticeships, employment and support and advice.

MULTI-AGENCY TRAINING



This workshop is for a maximum of 30 delegates for the 1 day's course and a maximum of 15 delegates for the half a day's course. They will learn the following topics:

- Geographical landscape of gangs
- The context of modern gangs
- Grooming and initiation
- Child sexual exploitation

We offer a 1 day's training and a half a day's training course for both local authority frontline & management staff, the police, probation and youth offending services, social services, mental health workers, care workers, faith groups, third sector, community organisations and teachers, who come into contact with young people involved in gangs or associated with street culture

OUTCOMES

- Understand the context and merging trends of modern gangs.
- Be able to identify children and young people who may be groomed into gangs, and by extension of initiation.
- Learn how to provide more effective intervention pathways for young people involved or at risk of gang membership.
