



## **CANON JOHNSON C. OF E. PRIMARY SCHOOL**

## Arrangements for Admission to Reception 2024/25

The number of places available in the Reception Year will be a maximum of 30 (admissions number).

This arrangement follows consultation between the FAO Trust, the Local Advisory Board, the LA, the Manchester Diocesan Board of Education and other admissions authorities in the area.

The governors will not place restrictions on admissions to Reception Year unless they are advised that applications have exceeded the published admissions number.

Governors have a duty to admit children for whom an Education Health Care Plan has been issued, which names the school.

In the event of over-subscription the governors will allocate places using the following criteria, which are listed in priority order. Please read these criteria in conjunction with the additional notes.

Where over-subscription occurs in applying the criterion 1-6, priority will be given to those pupils living nearest the school (see additional notes on how the distance is calculated).

- 1. **Children in Public Care (see section 2 note 1).** Looked after children and previously looked after children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order).
- 2. Church Foundation Places: Places are given to children of parents who worship regularly at Christ Church, Ashton. This means active membership (at least once a month, for 12 months prior to this application). This must be verified by having the school's supplementary form signed by the Vicar Of Christ Church. This form must be obtained from and returned to the school.
- 3. **Other Anglican Church Places:** Children whose parents regularly attend (at least once a month, for 12 months prior to this application) another Anglican Church. This must be verified by having the school's supplementary form signed by the minister of the church you attend. This form must be obtained from and returned to the school.
- 4. **Regular attendance at any other church belonging to Churches Together in Britain and Ireland:** Children whose parents regularly attend (at least once a month, for 12 months prior to this application) another Christian Church or a local Churches Together group, which is a member of the Churches Together in Britain and Ireland. This must be verified by having the schools supplementary form signed by the minister of the church you attend. This form must be obtained from, and returned to school.





- 5. Special medical or social circumstances affecting the child: All reasons should be included with the Application Form for consideration by the Admissions Panel and must be received on time. (see section 2 note 2)
- 6. Sibling Connection: Children with a brother or sister living at the same address and attending this school at the time of admission. This does not include Year 6 children who are leaving. (See section 2 Note 3).
- 7. Distance from school. Other children, giving priority to those living closest to the school. (See section 2 Note 4).

#### **Section 2 (Guidance Notes)**

## 1. Children in Public Care

This includes any "looked after child", "previously looked after children" and any child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, residence or special guardianship order. 'Looked after' means that the child was (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions.

This criteria also includes looked after children and all previously looked after children who appear (to the admission authority) to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted.

- 2. Special medical or social circumstances affecting the child. Where admission is sought under exceptional medical or social circumstances professional supporting evidence e.g. from a doctor, psychologist or social worker, is essential. Such evidence must set out the particular reasons why the school is the most suitable for your child and the difficulties that would be caused if your child had to attend another school.
- **3. Sibling:** The sibling criterion includes: natural sisters/brothers; half-sisters/brothers; step sisters/brothers; adopted sisters/brothers; sisters/brothers of fostered children; the child of the parent/carer's partner, or the child of the parent/carer's partner, and in each case living at the same address. This allows for the admittance of children whose siblings will still be attending the preferred school.

Where there are children of multiple births wishing to be admitted and the sibling is the 30<sup>th</sup> child, the governors may admit over the infant class size requirements if it is possible to do so.

**Infant Class Size** – Infant classes (those where the majority of children will reach the age of 5, 6 or 7 during the school year) **must not** contain more than 30 pupils with a single school teacher.

Additional children may be admitted under very limited exceptional circumstances. These children will remain an 'excepted pupil' for the time they are in an infant class or until the class numbers fall back to the infant class size limit. The excepted children are:

a) Children with an Education Health Care Plan admitted outside the normal admission round;





- **b)** Looked after children and previously looked after children admitted outside the normal admission round;
- c) Children admitted, after initial allocation of places, because of a procedural error made by the admission authority or local authority in the original application process;
- d) Children admitted after an independent appeals panel upholds an appeal;
- e) Children who move into the area outside the normal admission round for whom there is no other available school within reasonable distance;
- f) Children of UK service personnel admitted outside the normal admissions round;
- g) Twins and children from multiple births when one of the siblings is the 30<sup>th</sup> child admitted;
- **h)** Children with SEN who are normally taught in a SEN unit attached to the school, or registered at a special school, who attend some infant classes within the mainstream school.

#### 4. Distance

Distance will be measured as a straight line from the child's home address, using the address point assigned by the National Land and Property Gazetteer, to the main gate to the school property. Measurements will be made using the local authority's school admissions data mapping software, which uses a Geographical Information System based on Ordnance Survey.

The address from which distance will be measured will be the permanent residential address, at the time of application, of the parent with whom the child lives. Where a child lives with parents with shared responsibility, each for part of a week, the home address is the address from which the child travels to school for the majority of school days per week. If the number of days is exactly equal the home address will be that of the parent who receives the Child Benefit.

In the event of distances being the same for 2 or more applications where this distance would be the last place/s to be allocated, the place will be allocated to the pupil that is nearer using walking distance as measured using the local authority's school admissions data mapping software.

#### **Proof of Address**

Starting out and the application form asks for parents to provide two proofs of address from the following list:

- Home contents Insurance Certificate\*
- Buildings Insurance Certificate\*
- Recent utility bill (gas, electricity, water, land-line telephone bill not a mobile phone bill)\*\*
- Letter from solicitor confirming exchange of contracts on a house.\*\*

### **Late Applications**

The closing date for applications in the normal admissions round is 15<sup>th</sup> January.

Applications, which are received after this date will be considered after all applications received on time, have been processed.

#### **Deferred Admissions**

Children will be admitted to the Reception class at the beginning of the Autumn term before their fifth birthday, and to the nursery class at the beginning of the Autumn term before their fourth birthday. Parents may request that their school place be deferred until later in the school year and if they do this the place will be held for the child. They cannot, however, defer entry beyond the beginning of the term after the child's fifth birthday, nor beyond the school year for which the original application was accepted. Parents can also request that their child attends on a part-time basis until the child reaches compulsory school age.

#### **Waiting Lists**

If the school is oversubscribed the governors will maintain a waiting list. Parents, who have expressed the school as a preference and have not been offered a place at the school or at a higher preference school, will automatically be placed on the waiting list **until the end of the autumn term**. Other parents who have submitted an appeal or who have opted to go on the list will also be placed on the list. All pupils on the waiting list will be ranked according to the oversubscription criteria. Places will be offered, should any become available, to the highest ranked application received by the date the place becomes available. If new or late applications have a higher priority under the oversubscription criteria, they will be ranked higher than those who have been on the list for some time. A significant change of circumstances, such as a change of address, will be taken into account: evidence must be provided. Children who have been referred under the local authority's Fair Access protocol or who are the subject of a direction by the local authority to admit must be given precedence over any other children on the waiting list.

#### **Admission Outside Normal Age Range**

A request may be made for a child to be admitted outside of their normal age group, for example, if the child is gifted and talented or has experienced problems such as ill health. In addition, the parents of a summer born child, i.e. a child born between 1st April and 31st August, may request





that the child be admitted out of their normal age group, to reception rather than year 1. Parents should submit reasons for requesting admission for their child outside of the normal age range together with their application. The online application provides space to do this and you should also submit views of medical professionals as necessary. A decision will be made taking account of parents' wishes, information about the child's academic, social and emotional development; and whether they have previously been educated outside their normal age group. Each request will be treated on an individual basis having regard to the views of an educational professional who will be involved in educating the child. Parents should complete the online application and include details of their request to defer entry for their child. They may also contact the Admissions Team for further information.





#### **Admissions Information**

#### **Making an Application**

Applications for admission to Canon Johnson C of E Primary School should be made online, and also on the School's own form (this is not compulsory but it would be impossible to apply the faith criteria of the school if it is not completed). Both forms will be found on Tameside's website with the Local Authority's 'Starting Out' booklet (downloadable). All applications must be completed on line between the dates specified on the website. The school supplementary form is available at the end of this policy and on the school's website at www.canonjohnson.co.uk

### **Address of Pupil**

The address used on the school's admission form must be the current one at the time of application. If the address changes subsequently, the parents should notify the school. Where the parents live at different addresses, the current one at the time of application, normal address of the child will be the one used. This will normally be the one where the child wakes up for the majority of Monday to Friday mornings. Parents may be asked to show proof of address. Where there is a dispute about the correct address to use, the governors reserve the right to make enquiries of any relevant third parties.

If a child is cared for at another address e.g. child minder or grandparent or another member of the family, this address cannot be considered for the purpose of the admission process.

#### **Appeals**

Where the governors are unable to offer a place because the school is oversubscribed, parents have the right to appeal to an independent admission appeal panel, set up under the School Standards and Framework Act, 1998, as amended by the Education Act 2002. Parents should notify the clerk to the governors at the school within 20 days of receiving the letter refusing a place. Parents will have the opportunity to submit their case to the panel in writing and also to attend in order to present their case. You will normally receive 10 days' notice of the place and time of the hearing.

If your child was refused a place in Reception or Key Stage One because of Government limits to infant class sizes, the ground on which your appeal could be successful are limited. You would have to show that the decision was one which in the circumstances no reasonable governing body would have made, or that your child would have been offered a place if the governors' admissions arrangements had been properly implemented.

Please note that this right of appeal against the governors' decision does not prevent you in making an appeal in respect of any other school.





## **Fraudulent Applications**

Where the governing body discovers that a child has been awarded a place as the result of an intentionally misleading application from a parent e.g. address or of involvement in a place of worship which effectively denies a place to a child with a stronger claim, then the governing body is required to withdraw the offer of a place. The application will be considered afresh and a right of appeal offered if a place is refused.

## **In-year Admissions**

Applications for places mid-year will be carried out through the Local Authority's co-ordinated admissions scheme.

## **CANON JOHNSON CE PRIMARY SCHOOL**Arrangements for Admissions to Nursery 2024/25

### **Entitlement to Nursery Education Places**

All children are entitled to a free part-time nursery education place. That entitlement is from the term **after** their third birthday. However, provision is made by a range of providers and the local authority aims to provide places in the year before they enter Reception. Some places may be available for three year olds in the term after their third birthday if places are available.

From September 2012 each child is entitled to a maximum of 15 hours free early years education per week from the term following their third birthday. This entitlement can be delivered flexibly by the school (where it is able to do so and in response to parental demand). If the free entitlement is taken flexibly, it must be no less than two and a half hours per session and no more than 10 hours per day. The full 15 hours entitlement should be over no fewer than 2 days.

At Canon Johnson C. of E. Primary School, all places offered under this policy will be on a part time basis only (am) for sessions of three hours per day as requested through consultation. There are a maximum of 26 places for the morning session.

#### **Roles and Responsibilities**

The Local Authority will:

- Distribute Tameside's policy for nursery admissions to all appropriate Governing Bodies.
  - Provide schools with a standard nursery admissions application form
  - Review the Nursery Admissions Policy annually in conjunction with the nursery admissions consultation group
  - Disseminate information about nursery education providers via the Family Information Service. Provide guidance and support for Governing Bodies offering Nursery provision Publish timescales for Nursery Admissions annually
  - Measure distances by request

## The Governing Body/school will:

- Keep a record of all parents expressing an interest in a nursery place for their child. Send out application forms to parents of children, who have expressed an interest according to LA timescales.
- Make it clear on all correspondence to parents that a place in nursery does not guarantee a place in Reception. Inform parents in writing of an offer or a refusal according to LA timescales
- Provide copies of the following leaflets to parents who have been refused a place:
- Free entitlement funding Directory
- Admissions to Nursery Classes 2023/24

How to claim your free early education place

Parents / Carers are expected to:

- Register their interest in a particular school by contacting that school
- Complete and return an application form according to given timescales
- Confirm acceptance of a place

The governing body of Canon Johnson C. of E. Primary School will formulate an admissions policy which includes faith criteria and ensure that the policy complies with all relevant legislation, including The Code of Practice on the delivery of Free Early Years Provision for three and four year olds.

## **Allocation of Nursery Places**

Places will be allocated to Tameside residents who will be 4 years old between 1 September 2024 and 31 August 2025 in the first instance.

Places should be offered to children who will become 4 years old between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2024 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2025 (and therefore born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2020 and 31st August 2021).

Where a school receives less applications from Tameside residents who will be 4 years old between 1 September 2024 and 31 August 2025 than there are places available, all must be offered places.

Where a school receives more applications from Tameside residents who will be 4 years old between 1 September 2024 and 31 August 2025 than there are places available the following over subscription criteria must be applied in order.

Where over-subscription occurs in applying the criterion 1-6, priority will be given to those pupils living nearest the school.

- 1. **Children in Public Care.** Looked after children and previously looked after children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order).
- 2. **Church Foundation Places:** Places are given to children of parents who worship regularly at Christ Church, Ashton. months prior to this application) another Christian Church or a local Churches Together group, which is a member of Churches Together in Britain and Ireland. This must be verified by having the school's supplementary form signed by the minister of the church you attend. This form must be obtained from and returned to the school

Children with Exceptional Medical Needs or Home Circumstances and / or Special Educational Needs: Written evidence must be provided from a doctor or other agency that he/she has exceptional needs which means that admission to a particular school nursery is essential. A panel of governors will make a decision as to whether to admit a child under these criteria using the evidence provided. All information provided will be treated in the strictest confidence. It is anticipated that the total number of children allocated places according to these criteria would form only a small proportion of the total number of children attending the Nursery.

5. **Siblings:** this will apply where the applicant is 4 years old by 31<sup>st</sup> August 2024 and has brothers or sisters attending the school at the time of application, who will still be attending at the time of admission. Within the sibling tiebreaker, preference will be given to pupils living nearest to the school.

The sibling criterion includes; natural sisters/brothers; half-sisters/brothers; step sisters/brothers; adopted sisters/brothers; sisters/brothers of fostered children, and in each case living at the same address. This allows for the admittance of children whose siblings will still be attending the preferred school.

## 6. Age

Priority will be given to children in the following order:

- 6.1 Children who will be 4 years old by 31<sup>st</sup> December 2024.
  6.2 Children who will be 4 years old by 31<sup>st</sup> March 2025.
  6.3 Children who will be 4 years old by 31<sup>st</sup> August 2025.

#### **Tiebreaker - Distance**

Where over subscription occurs in applying criteria 7.1, 7.2 or 7.3, a tiebreaker will be applied to all applications remaining within the criteria. Priority will be given to applicants who live closest to the school.

\*Distance will be measured as a straight line from the child's home address, using the address point assigned by the National Land and Property Gazetteer, to the main gate to the school property. Measurements will be made using the local authority's school admissions data mapping software, which uses a Geographical Information System based on Ordnance Survey.

The address from which distance will be measured will be the permanent residential address, at the time of application, of the parent with whom the child lives. Where a child lives with parents with shared responsibility, each for part of a week, the home address is the address from which the child travels to school for the majority of school days per week. If the number of days is exactly equal the home address will be that of the parent who receives the Child Benefit.

In the event of distances being the same for 2 or more applications where this distance would be the last place/s to be allocated, the place will be allocated to the pupil that is

nearer using walking distance as measured using the local authority's school admissions data mapping software.

## Allocating places to children applying after the main allocation procedure has been completed

Where Canon Johnson C. of E. Primary School still has nursery places available after the main allocation process has been completed, the Governing Body will offer places to subsequent applicants on a 'first come first served basis', as long as that child is of the correct age (i.e. will become 4 years old between 1<sup>St</sup> September 2024 and 31<sup>St</sup> August 2025) and therefore born between 1<sup>St</sup> September 2020 and 31st August 2021. Should a parent request a place after the allocation process and the school has places available, a place should normally be offered.

### **Waiting Lists**

Where the school has allocated all its nursery places, it will operate a waiting list. If a place becomes available, it should be allocated to a child on the waiting list according to the over subscription criteria.

If Canon Johnson C. of E. Primary School still has nursery places available after the start of term in September 2024, the governing body may offer places to children who will become 3 years old between 1st September 2024 and 31<sup>st</sup> December 2025.

Pupils will not be able to start in the nursery until the beginning of the term **after** they become 3 i.e. January 2024 at the earliest. Pupils accepted into the nursery in this category will not be required to apply for a place in September 2025 as they will automatically continue in the nursery.

## Offering places to children who will become 3 years old between 1<sup>st</sup> January 2024 and 31<sup>st</sup> March 2025.

The governing body may decide that it will offer empty places to pupils who will become 3 years old between 1st January 2024 and 31<sup>st</sup> March 2025 if there are still places available after the start of term in January 2025. Pupils will not be able to start in the nursery until the beginning of the term after they become 3 i.e. after Easter 2025 at the earliest. Pupils accepted into the nursery in this category will not be required to apply for a place in September 2025 as they will automatically continue in the nursery. Where Canon Johnson C of E. Primary School receives more applications in this category than there are places available the over subscription criteria must be applied in the order as described earlier in this policy with age being children who will be 3 years old by 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024 to start after Easter 2025.

# Canon Johnson C. of E. Primary School Applying for a Nursery Place at our School

- 1. Contact the school and register your interest in having a place for your child give details to main office (child's name, date of birth, address and contact phone number. This can be done at any time after birth!
- 2. The school will keep a record of all parents expressing an interest in a nursery place for their child.
- 3. When your child is of the correct age as described in the policy, the school will send you an application form which MUST be filled in and returned to school by the deadline given on the form.
- 4. Application forms will be sent out by the school in January each year.
- 5. The school will use the oversubscription criterion described in the policy if more children apply than there are places available.
- 6. In March the school will write to offer or refuse your child a place in our nursery.
- 7. If you are offered a place you will need to complete and return the acceptance slip to the school as soon as possible after receiving the offer of a place. There will be a deadline for the acceptance of the place.
- 8. Parents who have been refused a place will be sent the following leaflets:

- 9. You and your child will be visited at home in September before your child starts.
- 10. You and your child will also visit school in September before your child's start date.
