

Travel

• Home to School Transport: Local authorities' duty to provide free home to school transport to eligible children remains the same.

Children are eligible if:

- they are of compulsory school age
- \circ attend their nearest suitable school and it is beyond walking distance
- or are unable to walk to school because of their special educational needs, disability/mobility problems or because the route is unsafe.

• **IGO Pass:** Children aged 5 to 10 and live or go to school in Greater Manchester will need an igo card to buy some of the tickets available for the concessionary child bus fare in Greater Manchester. For those aged 11 to 16, they must have an igo card to travel using any child ticket on buses in Greater Manchester.

 16 – 18 Free Bus Travel: Families with school leavers can apply for a travel pass which provides free bus travel across Greater Manchester from aged 16 to 18. For a one-off £10 fee, members can travel on most local buses, any day of the week, for free. To apply:

Uniform

 Since 2012, Tameside has acted in line with many other local authorities and no longer has a clothing grant scheme. The Council retains a small amount of money to support parents/ cares in exceptional circumstances. The fund is only available through professional/school. For eligibility criteria and how to apply:

Clothing Grant - Hardship Fund (tameside.gov.uk)

• For all Tameside residents. Action Together collect used school uniforms. Collected from schools lost property and donations received from parents. Clothing is stored and then distributed to parents in need. The distribution is undertaken self-referral or professional referral, which includes schools. 100% confidentiality is maintained.
