Information about volunteering for Ready, Set, Read

- This opportunity is open to young people aged 12 to 18.
- If you want to volunteer you need to complete and hand in the application form
 (available from Tameside libraries and online:
 www.tameside.gov.uk/libraries/src/volunteer) by Saturday 8th July 2023.
 We may not accept late applications
- If you are 16, 17 or 18 you will need to provide details of someone we can contact for a reference, and you will not be able to volunteer if we do not receive a satisfactory response from them. If you will still be 15 or under by August 24th, you do not need a reference.
- Please make sure your form is signed by yourself and a parent/guardian!

To complete the programme you will need to:

- Come to **one** of the briefing and induction meetings at Ashton Library: **either** Thursday 20th July at 4.30 5.30 **or** Saturday 22nd July at 11.00 12.00.
- Arrange a visit to your library to meet the staff and find out about what to do if there is an emergency. You will be given contact details at your induction.
- Help out at Ready,Set, Read! activities at Tameside libraries in the summer holidays (list
 of days and times below) for a minimum of three sessions. Arrangements can be made
 to accommodate holidays.
- You don't have to do all your sessions at the same library and you can do more days and/or locations if you want to! Just put as much information as you can on your form.

What do the activities involve?

- Our activities are attended by children of all ages up to about 11 and their parents and carers.
- At each session there is a simple craft activity, a treasure hunt and a game. These are planned in advance.
- We also talk to the children about the books they have been reading for the challenge. They have to read 6 books over July and August.
- We ask you to come half an hour before the start to find out what we're doing and help set up, and to stay half an hour at the end to help clear away.
- Some activity sessions attract large numbers, so it can be very busy.

- You will be able to develop your planning, communication and teamwork skills and your confidence! It's also a great way to get involved in your local community, do something useful with your time in the holidays and make new friends.
